Below are several of the projects where our Facilities, Maintenance, or Building and Grounds departments are involved:

Middle School Project

Essentially this project is complete. We are currently working outside of the building – clearing brush, re-sloping the hill, spreading mulch, seed, and laying sod on the west side of the campus grounds.

Simulation Labs and MLT

These are two separate projects, both funded by Federal grants. The Medical Simulation/Telehealth/ Mobile Medical Lab are all separate phases of a grant awarded by EDA, while the Medical Lab Technician grant is a Community Development Block Grant funded project. We bid the Sim Labs earlier this month, and the bid opening is scheduled for April 18, with the Med Lab Technician grant will hopefully bid by mid-May 2024.

Other projects

- Aerial Lineman Pole Yard in DQ the 100' x 36' Vehicle and Equipment storage facility for this program is currently going up it should complete in a couple months the college is responsible for electrical work once building is dried in.
- Mobile Medical Lab bid has been awarded and the vehicle should be ready for deliver in May 2024
- Planning to get all HVAC thermostats on network to be controlled remotely summer 2024.

- 2. March 2024 began with sixteen (16) participants in the YouthBuild program.
 - Several participants made measurable skill gains on the Test of Adult Basic Education, TABE®.
 - Three (3) of the participants successfully completed the General Educational Development (GED®) test, indicating their readiness to move on to college level training or a better job. Several others passed portions of the test.
 - Three (3) participants earned an Arkansas Workforce Alliance for Growth in the Economy (WAGETM) certification. This certification is unique from other career readiness programs in that it focuses on improving the basic academic skills of participants while providing workforce preparation and workforce training activities.
 - Four (4) completed Forklift safety training. This course helps fulfill the classroom and practical OSHA forklift training requirements of 29 CFR 1910.178(I). It covers topics that are critical to avoiding accidents and injuries, including general safety, preoperation, operation, load handling, fuel/battery maintenance, and specialized units.

- Participants built a stage for the Fiesta Fest as requested by the UA Cossatot Foundation.
- Five (5) participants completed their jobsite assignments and all others are continuing to get hands-on experience while working on the assigned construction jobsite.



- Five (5) participants successfully completed the YouthBuild program. The other eleven (11) participants will continue to work on their GED® until the end of April.

Social Media

Much of our focus in this two month period was spent plannig and facilitating a series of events in conjunction with the Total Eclipse of April 8th. We made numerous social media posts promoting the Sevierly Dark Festival in De Queen and the Nashville Chamber of Commerce Glow run, both of which were held on Saturday, April 6th.



In addition, our De Queen campus hosted a number of visitors to our area, who came to view the eclipse, from places as far away as Spain and South Korea. These visitors paid a small fee to view the event from our campus, with those fees going to benefit the UA Cossatot Foundation. Vice Chair Mike Cranford called the regular meeting of the Board of Visitors to order at 12:15 p.m. following a light meal at the UA Cossatot Lockesburg Community Room.

Staff Reports

Chancellor Cole briefly presented the chancellor's report to the Board on the Governor's new workforce plan. He shared how we have already been implementing workforce training through our continuing education program such as aerial lineman, CDL training, Medical Assisting programs, and more. Dr. Cole Assured the board that we are very responsive and will continue to adapt with the changes as the workforce industry continues to grow. Chancellor Cole also updated our board on our recent developments with the 501C3 Samaritan Fields, owned by Esteban Ochoa and his father. UA Cossatot has begun exploring the possibilities for the purchase of the Samaritan fields.

Vice Chancellor Charlotte presented the latest financial report to the board. In the summary of Unrestricted & Auxiliary revenues a little over 8.1 million after spring registration posted. The Expenditures are up from this time last year at 6.7 million. In Accounts Receivable, the Yearly Change has increased. In Grants & Other Restricted Programs we have earned a little over 2.6 million out of the 10.6 million multiple year grants. Our adult education TANF funds were ended earlier than expended due to the governor's decision to cut those funds across the board. The numbers for the Schedule of Bank Accounts are a little over 5 million in the bank, compared to this time last year we're in the same range. The college is over 1 million in total for Schedule of Investments- Certificate of Deposits. Pooled investments have also increased to 531,000. The total endowment funds are a little over 158,000, which is up by 100,000 of what we were at last year at this time. Chancellor Cole reiterated that we have diligently been working on our budget process for next year's budget which will be submitted to the UA System in May.

Vice Chancellor Dr. Ashley Aylett presented the latest Academic Services report. Dr. Aylett commented on our transition to workday for enrollment this fall semester. Dr. Aylett elaborated on our high recruitment, she along with other of her colleagues have been visiting our local high schools and preregistering seniors who plan on attending UCA next semester. This has been extremely beneficial for students and has helped tremendously build that bridge to transition from high school to college. Enrollment for concurrent students is up by 1% this Spring compared to Fall of 2023. Dr. Aylett celebrated our PTA program for having a 100% pass rate. Dr. Aylett and Suzanne ward answered questions on the Highschool Feeder Statistics (2015-2023) Chart.

Vice Chancellor Mike reported a Facilities update. The Middle School Project is officially complete. Our next emphasis will be on the Simulation Labs. We anticipate having a contractor selected by early April. The expected time frame for this project to be completed is between 150-210 days. Dr. Cole emphasized the importance of this project along with our Mobil Medical Labs due to the fact that many of our programs are contingent on them. Mike mentioned we are currently taking bids for the Aerial Lineman bucket trucks storage building project. In other business related to facilities, Dr. Cole clarified our involvement in the solar project with the UA System rather than with the Sevier County Solar Project.

Madelyn Jones reported on behalf of the College Relations report. Madelyn emphasized our involvement with the eclipse planning in conjunction with the Sevier County Fair Boards and the Sevier County Chamber of Commerce to host the Sevierly Dark Festival that will take place Saturday April 6th. UA Cossatot has made the decision to move our annual Fiesta Fest Event to Friday April 5th. This shift will give us the opportunity to kickoff eclipse festivities and further support the community. We will also be renting day of parking passes for the solar eclipse located on our De Queen campus. These will be available for purchase prior to the event and the day of the event. Madlyn shared our new event "Coffee with the Chancellor". There will be scheduled days on each campus where the community can come have coffee and doughnuts with our chancellor Dr. Cole and indulge in conversation. Our first gathering in Nashville was very successful. We look forward to hosting in De Queen on March 12th and Ashdown on April 23rd. College relations will be planning a drawdown in the fall.

APPEALS & COMPLAINTS INVOLVING STUDENTS

Non-Grade Issues

UA Cossatot does not tolerate actions by students or staff that interfere with student learning and safety. Students have the right to grieve an action by an employee or another student if the action related to improper conduct includes but is not limited to harassment of any kind, bullying, threatening another individual or the college, or terroristic threats.

Complaints for issues unrelated to improper conduct may be made to the appropriate Division Chair or program director who then has the ultimate responsibility to resolve the complaint.

Grade Issues
