The Impact of the High School Enrollment Cliff at UA Cossatot

The "high school enrollment cliff" refers to a projected decline in the number of high school graduates, expected to significantly impact higher education institutions across the United States, including UA Cossatot. This demographic shift is primarily due to lower birth rates following the Great Recession of 2008, which will result in fewer students graduating from high school and, consequently, fewer students enrolling in colleges and universities. For UA Cossatot, the high school enrollment cliff is already presenting a substantial challenge. As the pool of potential students shrinks, we will continue to face a decline in new student enrollments. This decrease could affect our revenue, as fewer students mean less tuition income, which is a critical component of our funding. Additionally, with more colleges and universities competing for a smaller number of high school graduates, UA Cossatot will need to intensify our recruitment efforts to maintain our student base.

To counteract the effects of the enrollment cliff, we will have to continue to diversify our recruitment strategies. One approach could be to expand our focus beyond recent high school graduates to include non-traditional students, such as adult learners, veterans, and those seeking to reskill or change careers. By offering flexible learning options, such as online courses, evening classes, and accelerated programs, we may be able to attract a broader range of students who are looking for education that fits their schedules and needs.

Another strategy is to keep strengthening our partnerships with local high schools, businesses, and community organizations. By enhancing our existing dual enrollment programs, apprenticeship opportunities, and customized training programs that align with local workforce needs, we can continue to position ourselves as a valuable educational resource for both students and employers. Also, as the number of incoming students decreases, retaining current students becomes even more critical. We can mitigate the impact of the enrollment cliff by investing in even more student retention initiatives, such as enhanced academic advising, enhanced tutoring services, and enhanced career counseling. We already sustain an almost 50% graduation rate, but by raising that even further beyond 50%, we can offset even more effects of the enrollment cliff.

The high school enrollment cliff poses a significant challenge to but by adopting proactive strategies such as diversifying student recruitment efforts, expanding partnerships, and focusing on retention, I believe we are and can continue to navigate these demographic changes. By adapting to the evolving educational landscape, UA Cossatot can continue to fulfill our mission of providing relevant education to Sevier, Howard, Little River, and Pike counties.

Public Services & Workforce Development Report

1. The college’s Workforce Development staff joined the Rapid Response Team of Arkansas Workforce Connections / Arkansas Department of Commerce for Worker Assistance Workshops for the dislocated workers from Husqvarna in Nashville, Arkansas. This is plant closure will affect approximately 650 workers by the end of 2024.

Multiple workshops were held throughout each day, Tuesday – Thursday, August 13-15, 2024. College staff presented information on credit and short-term non-credit career training programs, adult education, and financial aid. The workshops were designed to allow the affected workers time after the presentations to mingle with the respective agencies and workforce partners and receive information about services and programs that are available to assistance them during this transition period.

3. The Office of Skills Development will continue to fund the Aerial Lineman Program in FY 2024-2025. As a result, the program will remain free to Arkansas residents and supportive services will be made available to eligible participants. Graduates will also receive over \$3,000 of personal protective equipment and climbing gear to help launch their career.
4. Supporting the mission of the five-year Title III grant received from the U.S. Department of Education’s Strengthening Institutions Program and the Higher Education Act in October 2020, Workforce Development staff administered a soft skills survey. The data obtained from this annual survey is used to align the college’s soft skills instruction with local employer needs.

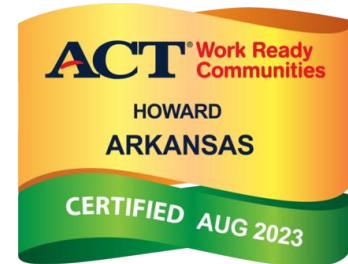

The primary purpose of the *free* Arkansas National Career Readiness Certificate Program is to positively impact the economy in Arkansas by helping job seekers build their workplace skills, respond to employer needs, and increase the likelihood of a job seeker's success.

The CRC team consisting of staff members associated with multiple departments within the college:

- Verify job seekers have an Arkansas Job Link Account
- Administer WorkKeys Curriculum Pretests to determine if the job seeker is ready to take the WorkKeys assessments
- Provide remediation training using WorkKeys Curriculum, if the individual does not score adequately on the WorkKeys Curriculum Pretest
- Conducts WorkKeys Assessments
- Prints and distributes AR National Career Readiness Certificates (AR NCRCs) to successful examinees

The college radio station staff produced several social media videos in July and August, promoting events in the area. Among the videos, was a three part series with the Sevier County Chamber of Commerce featuring a tour of the renovated office building, a segment promoting local tourism, and a look at the Chamber’s new small business center.



The college radio station produced and posted a series of three videos promoting the Arkansas Transfer Scholarship which enables eligible UA Cossatot Associate Degree earners to transfer to UA Fayetteville at the UA Cossatot tuition rate. Ed 88 livestreamed a letter of intent signing of a Fouke High School basketball player to the UA Cossatot Lady Colts on July 17, and we interviewed Santa for the Sevier County Chamber of Commerce “Christmas in July” announcement.

Vice Chair Mike Cranford called the regular meeting of the Board of Visitors to order at 12:06 p.m. following a light meal at the UA Cossatot Lockesburg Community Room.

Staff Reports

Chancellor Dr. Cole welcomed and reported to the Board on a glimpse of the upcoming year. As we move forward in creating a great year for us all it is nice to have a plan and what we will be able to accomplish. This year the Vice Chancellor of Facilities, Mike Kinkade, will be retiring. Dr. Cole requested for Mike to develop a Facilities Master Plan that will outline the necessary improvements and expansions of our physical infrastructure. The College will be celebrating our 50th Anniversary this upcoming 2025 and we will plan a series of events and initiatives. One of the first programs we offered at our college was Nursing. Dr. Cole mentioned we will keep developing our athletics and facilities as well as developing more credit and non-credit programs in our Workforce Development department. Another goal we are looking to reach this upcoming year is developing more relationships with other entities. Dr. Cole was invited to visit Goodwill Industries in Little Rock where he toured the facility. There he learned all the educational programs they have in partnering with schools. They have not partnered with a 2-year college in the past so this would be a good opportunity for us to develop a partnership with them and be a part of the education programs they offer. Lastly, Dr. Cole spoke about the planning has begun to work on the next Strategic Plan for our college.

Vice Chancellor Charlotte reported on the financial condition of the college. At the end of May in the summary of Unrestricted & Auxiliary total revenues were a little over 11.2 million, this is down due to tuition and fees from where we were this time last year. The Expenditures are at 10.4 million more than last year. Our net increase is at 735,000 that is unrestricted. Our Accounts Receivable is over 1 million, this is down from last year. In Grants & Other Restricted Programs we have 10.5 million in total for multi-year grants and have earned 4.3 million to date. In the Schedule of Bank Accounts, the college is at 4.9 million which is down a couple 100,000 from last year at this time. Charlotte proceeded to report the college is at a little over 1 million in CDs and investments. In our pooled investments we have earned 530,000 which is doing well. In the total endowment funds total, the college is at 161,000 this has increased from inputting Title III monies.

Vice Chancellor Dr. Ashley Aylett reported enrollment is down we stand at 700 for the Fall. We are hopeful students are late to start enrolling and as summer ends, they will start enrolling. Workday could be causing a barrier for this enrollment delay as it is a new system for all. Dr. Aylett shared with the board data trends on graduates, number of degrees/certificates awarded, and high school graduates from college

courses. Other data trends shared included award types, comparisons of degree types, and graduate's hometown. Data about Summer enrollment was created to compare enrollment and courses offered this summer.

Vice Chancellor Mike reported on the facilities noting the cafeteria update as we expand the Café on the De Queen campus to be more equipped for our athletes to receive 3 meals a day Monday- Friday. Mik shared the Lockesburg projects are completed and wrapped up. The simulation lab projects are still underway and after 2 years we have contractors coming to the Nashville campus to begin construction. The college is still seeking an instructor for Medical Lab Tech. Mobil Medical Labs have been delivered and are located on the Ashdown campus. We are awaiting a date to have them wrapped with our logos. Mike mentioned a shed and tool storage has now been completed for the Aerial Lineman program. Mike expressed his service towards the college as this is his last board meeting. Mike will be retiring August 30.


