Classroom and hands-on field experiences equip students with the knowledge, skills and abilities employers seek when hiring an aerial lineman to install, maintain, and repair telecommunications infrastructure, including:

- Working knowledge of established aerial plant installation procedures and techniques involving the
 placement of fiber, cable, poles, anchors, and all ancillary components coupled with the ability to use
 required installation equipment
- The ability to read and understand prints/maps, safety rules, and operating instructions
- Adequate skills using the appropriate hand tools, equipment, and fleet required to build successful aerial plants

Entrance Requirements

Cossatot Community College of the University of Arkansas seeks to meet the needs of the public by providing open enrollment into the Broadband Essentials and Aerial Lineman: Communication courses. To be admitted, applicants must meet the following requirements and submit a completed Aerial Lineman Application for Admission.

Broadband Essentials

(1) Be at least 18 years of age

Aerial Lineman: Communications

- (1) Successful completion of Arkansas Fiber Academy's Broadband Essentials course
- (2) Be at least 18 years of age
- (3) Have a valid driver's license
- (4) Able to lift/carry up to 75 lbs. without assistance
- (5) Able to climb telephone poles up to 40 feet and work aloft in a bucket truck
- (6) Able to pass a drug screening

Upon application to the program, an advisor will provide additional instructions on where and how the drug screen will be administered at no cost to the applicant.

Cost

The Broadband Essentials and Aerial Lineman: Communications courses are free to eligible participants. The cost of the training is underwritten by a grant from the Office of Skills Development.

Tools and equipment are provided to students for use during the course. Certifications embedded in the courses are also offered at no cost to students.

Students participating in the *Broadband Essentials* course are responsible for:

Pen and paper

Students participating in the *Aerial Lineman: Communications* course are responsible for:

- · Pen and paper
- Lineman climbing boots
- [Recommended] Three (3) long sleeved shirts that provide the flexibility and range of motion needed to move and climb. One (1) long sleeved shirt will be issued during the course of training for use as required during all field exercises.

What to Look for in a Climbing Boot

Required for Training:

- Minimum of 6" height
- · Shank in the mid-sole
- Steel or composite toe
- Heal with a square front
- Firm sole, no soft rubber

Recommended, Not Required for Training:

- Leather upper
- Waterproof
- Some future employers may require boots meeting ASTM F2892-11 EH standards

While there is no cost for the pre-admission drug screen for applicants that receive a negative result and complete the course, applicants that receive a positive result or drop/withdraw from the course assume full responsibility for the cost of the pre-admission drug screen and will be billed accordingly.

Application for Admission

Applying is easy. No transcripts or tests are required for admission into the program. Simply complete an Aerial Lineman Application for Admission and submit it to Continuing Education Services via fax, mail or in-person along with the required attachments. Continuing Education advisors are available to assist applicants throughout the admission process.

Enrollment

Once the Application for Admission and drug screen results (required only for the Aerial Lineman: Communications course) is received, they are processed on a first come, first-serve basis. Once approved for admission into the program, applicants have their first choice of available training dates.

Attendance Requirements

Broadband Essentials and Aerial Lineman: Communications are both fast-paced intensive courses with stringent attendance requirements. Students are expected to arrive promptly and be present for all class sessions and field exercises. Any class session or activity missed whole or in part, regardless of cause, reduces the opportunity for learning and may adversely affect a student's ability to meet the learning outcomes required to receive a Certificate of Completion. Persons with life or health conditions that may hinder attendance may wish to delay application for admission until a strong commitment to attendance can be made.

If an emergency arises, students must contact their instructor as early as possible prior to the start of class to best ensure arrangements can be made to make-up missed instruction time. Make-up sessions are subject to the availability of an instructor and are not guaranteed; therefore, students who are late or miss class for any reason are not guaranteed they will be able to make up missed instruction time or successfully complete the course. Students may be subject to expulsion from the program due to lack of attendance at the point that a student has missed 25% of the class (10 clocks hours for Broadband Essentials, 26¼ clock hours for Aerial Lineman: Communications).

If provision for supplemental training is requested and/or required in order to meet course requirements, the student shall be responsible for the costs incurred including payment of a classroom instructor hired by Continuing Education Services, their own transportation and other associated costs should they accept these arrangements.

Dress Code

A long sleeved shirt that provides the flexibility and range of motion needed to move and climb, jeans/pants, climbing boots, and personal protective equipment are required for field exercises. Personal protective equipment is provided to students for use during the course. Failure to observe the dress code and/or failure to comply with other program guidelines may result in termination from the program.

Requirements for Successful Completion

- (1) Attend required training sessions
- (2) Complete all required quizzes and assignments
- (3) Demonstrate safe practice
- (4) Comply with program guidelines
- (5) Achieve a passing grade of 70% or greater

Student Conduct
