

FINANCIAL AID FOR NON-CREDIT CONTINUING EDUCATION PROGRAMS

GOVERNMENT AND PUBLIC AID PROGRAMS

While Continuing Education courses do not qualify for federal Pell Grants, a variety of alternative financial aid sources are available to help individuals pay for non-credit career-focused training. Financial assistance may cover various education expenses such as tuition, fees, books, supplies and transportation.

Attached are resources provided by a variety of government and public aid programs to help you learn about and take advantage of available financial aid options. These sources have varying eligibility criteria and benefits to assist students.

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EMPLOYEE TUITION ASSISTANCE

Some employers provide tuition assistance as an employee benefit. To find out if your employer offers tuition assistance, you can talk to your manager or supervisor, ask your HR representative or check out your employee guides.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: How do I check on the status of my financial aid?

A: Contact your financial aid source directly, using the contact information provided. Your sponsor will able to provide you with an update on the status of your application and inform you of any pending actions required to complete the process.

Q: How do I check the status of my Continuing Education registration request?

Q: What is third-party billing mentioned on the registration form?

A: When a student's tuition, books and/or supplies are billed directly to an outside agency or organization, such as one of the financial aid options included in this packet or an employer, the process is termed third party billing. The college agrees to bill the agency or organization directly on behalf of the student. Once written authorization from the sponsoring agency or organization is received third party billing requests can be processed.

NEXT STEPS

Step 1: Review financial aid options, giving attention to eligibility criteria, and identify the source(s) that are a best fit for you in meeting your educational goals.

Step 2: Contact the preferred financial aid source(s), using the contact information provided.

Let them know you are interested in attending a career training program at UA Cossatot and would like to learn more about eligibility for training funds.

Step 3: Follow the instructions provided by the financial source to apply for financial assistance.

Once the college receives written authorization of sponsorship from your financial aid source, your seat in the course will be held provided all other admission requirements have been met.

Written authorization from the sponsoring agency or organization may be a letter of authorization on the sponsor's letterhead or other documentation of sponsorship (i.e. purchase request) that includes the sponsoring organizations name, address, telephone number, and name of the course(s) to be paid, and the total amount to be paid by the sponsor.

Third-party billing will hold course(s) provided Continuing Education Services received the appropriate authorization by the published "register by" date and the students fulfills all other admission requirements.

Agencies or organizations requiring course completion or proof of grades before they authorize payment are considered tuition reimbursement programs. These programs do not qualify for the third party billing process. Students participating in tuition reimbursement programs are responsible for making their own payment arrangements and for getting tuition reimbursed directly from their sponsor agency or organization.





The purpose of the scholarship is for workforce training in high-demand areas of healthcare, information technology, and industry. Classes are not limited to credit-bearing programs. Non-credit, workforce-training classes that fit into the three above categories may also qualify.

Requirements

- 1. Be an Arkansas resident
- 2. Must be a high school graduate or received high school equivalency
- 3. Student cannot be a current recipient of the Academic Challenge Scholarship
- 4. Be accepted for admission into an approved program as defined by ADHE

Arkansas Workforce Challenge Award Amount

The Workforce Challenge Award will be the cost of a certificate program or program of study not to exceed \$800.

Deadline for Application

Students must apply at least 30 days prior to enrollment in an eligible program.

Basic Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Be an Arkansas resident
- 2. Must be a high school graduate or received high school equivalency
- 3. Cannot be a current recipient of the Academic Challenge Scholarship
- 4. Be accepted for admission into an approved program as defined by ADHE

Continuing Eligibility

Arkansas Workforce Challenge is a non-renewable grant. Students who successfully complete their program of study will be allowed to reapply for the award in another eligible program. Students who receive funding from Workforce Challenge and do not successfully complete their program will be allowed to reapply one time.
